Trinity Homes Sponsors Micro-Economy in Dominican Republic

Ellicott City, MD (January 2007) - Trinity Homes, as part of their long time philanthropic partnership with Food for the Poor, has completed their most recent project in San Juan, “Trinity Farms and Agricultural Training Center.” Together they are supporting an enduring self-help community as part of Food for The Poor’s self-sustainability project.

Trinity Homes completed the project by constructing two aggregate ponds with piping to harvest tilapia, wooden structures to house animal pens, and a training center. The purpose of this facility is to promote self-sustainability in the community of El Cercado in San Juan by providing local residents with employment as well as supplying fish and meat to various feeding centers around the region. The successful center is considered to be “...one of the premiere models...” for the Food for the Poor projects;

The tilapia ponds are yielding incredible results. The center is also in the process of testing the ponds to determine if they can successfully harvest shrimp as well.
